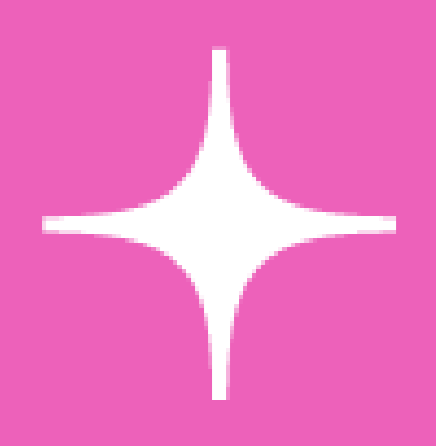

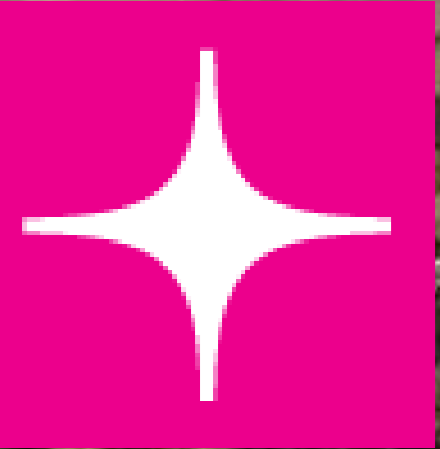

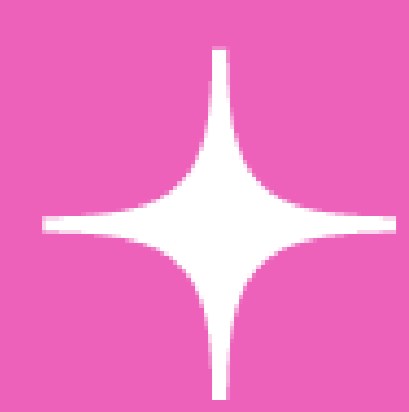

What if education wasn't a subject, but a lens - a way of asking big questions about the world?

- **What is knowledge?** Who creates it? What counts as “truth”?
- **What is childhood?** Is it fixed, or shaped by culture, history, or capitalism?
- **What is play?** Why do we play? Who gets to play? What happens when play is controlled?
- **Is there a difference between education and schooling?** When does learning begin and end? How are we learning in adulthood?
- **How do our identities shape how we're seen and treated in society?** Is education affirming our identities? Can learning help resist inequities?
- **What even is a 'mind'?** How do emotions, relationships, trauma, and mindfulness shape how we understand ourselves and others?
- **What does it mean to “grow up”?** When does youth begin, or end?

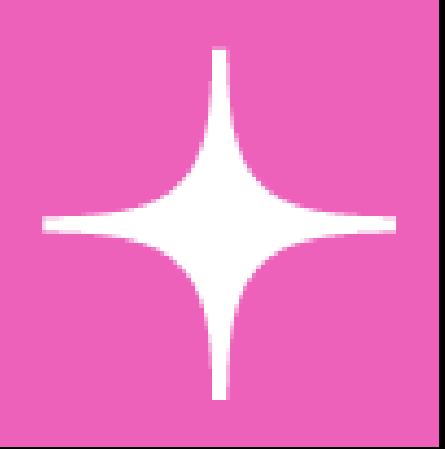
